For almost seven years Alex worked in Belfast as minister of the McCracken Memorial Presbyterian Church.

He completed his PhD studies in history — focusing on the theme of reconciliation in American Presbyterianism — at the University of Notre Dame after which he returned to Northern Ireland, working in various roles with Corrymeela up until his appointment.
